ENGAGING RURAL COMMUNITIES (ERC) PROGRAMME

This is a new and exciting project being delivered by local Rural Support Networks CWSAN & COSTA. This project is supported by the European Union's PEACE IV Programme and is managed by the Special EU programmes Body (SEUPB) in partnership with Mid Ulster District Council.

Community groups within the Mid Ulster District Council are being invited to contact Community Engagement Officer Jennifer for potential inclusion in this project. The project has been developed for those groups at early stages of development who are interested in developing their capacities to undertake cross community activities and develop shared projects in the same area, neighbouring area or with a group of similar interest.

A small grant will be available for up to 12 groups across mid Ulster rural areas to work on a partnership project.

The official launch of the project took place on 1st March and local groups are being encouraged to apply for inclusion in the project.

The Rural Communities Programme will be run over a period of 2.5 years and will take groups through 4 phases of development, providing training sessions, facilitation and mentoring throughout. Groups are most welcome to speak directly to Jennifer Hamilton, the projects new Community Engagement Officer, who will assist you ascertain how and if you might fit the projects criteria. It is expected that there will be huge interest from rural community organisations and thus there will be a process of selection at early stages. Those groups who are from marginalised sectors within the council area will be prioritised in selection.

Jennifer has been appointed as the Community Engagement Officer and has a wide range of experience in single identity and cross community work, working with a wide range of groups and funding bodies.

Community Sector Adult Safeguarding Awareness for Community Groups

Are you aware of your responsibilities when it comes to preventing, recognising and responding to adult abuse?

All community and voluntary groups working with adults are expected to meet minimum safeguarding standards.

This includes:

- Recognising that adult harm is wrong
- Being aware of the signs of harm from abuse
- Reducing opportunities for harm to occur
- · Knowing when and how to report.

By building up this awareness at community level, we are all better able to prevent abuse and get support at an early stage, reducing the risk of someone experiencing serious harm.

So what does this mean for community groups?

In practical terms, this can mean accessing training and sharing information so that everyone involved with your group knows what behaviour is unacceptable and how to recognise it. It also means looking at practices within your organisation, in areas such as recruitment and risk management, to reduce opportunities for harm in your setting. Some groups will need to put more robust practices in place.

Under the new regional adult safeguarding policy, introduced in 2015, groups providing services targeted at adults who may be more at risk of harm must meet higher governance standards. This could include, for example, a good neighbour service for local elderly residents, a homelessness outreach project or running sports activities for adults with learning disabilities. These groups will have volunteers or staff who are required to be vetted under the Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups (NI) Order 2007.

In addition to reviewing internal policies and practices, these groups must appoint an Adult Safeguarding Champion, who will be responsible for leading on safeguarding issues within the organisation and is also required to report annually on these, producing an Annual Position Report and submitting data to the HSC Trust. ->

Local support and training is available.

The minimum standards are covered in a new awareness course, now available to community groups in the Southern Trust area from Community Sector Training. Delivered through video clips, discussion and activities, the 2 hour training helps participants to know how to recognise abuse and respond where they have concerns. Training can be requested free of charge for delivery in your own venue.

Ruth Allen, Coordinator of Community Sector Training, explains:

"It doesn't matter if you are organising social activities, running a sports club or you are a faith group — safeguarding is everyone's responsibility. All of us need this basic awareness of how adults in our community may be harmed and how to get the support they need."

Community Sector Training also offers training to community development workers, to enable them to support local community and voluntary groups and networks to understand their responsibilities under the adult safeguarding policy and procedures.

More advanced training is available to groups who are working with adults at risk. This is provided through Volunteer Now and includes more detailed training for staff and volunteers, as well as training tailored for Adult Safeguarding Champions and those in management roles. A number of courses are delivered across the Southern Trust area each year, with free places available.
